MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I can't tell you how many times I've been talking with someone and it comes around to my telling folks what I do and where I work, and the immediate response is, "Oh, my children or grandchildren or nieces or nephews went to Preschool there! They loved it! What a great place!"

The reputation of our Preschool, which now also includes a Kindergarten, is out there...and it's great! We are influencing the lives and families of our community to be sure! For 47 years, our Preschool has served this community by inspiring our community's children to embrace a love of learning and has set up so many children to succeed in both school and in life.

Our Preschool was started by members of FLRB back in 1972. Since then it has always been a ministry of FLRB, one the congregation has always embraced and valued.

We have an enrollment of 120 students supported by 13 teachers and assistants, yet only 10% of those students are members of FLRB and only 50% have any sort of church home at all. What we are supporting through this program is not only education that inspires learning and teaches children the things that will set them up to succeed in school and life, but a place where the faith is taught and embraced. Weekly chapel which includes myself and other church staff, classroom lessons that focus on biblical stories and themes, celebrating Christian festivals, and teaching Christian values has been a way for FLRB to "make disciples of all nations" by sharing our faith warmly, and authentically with others, all within the context of a Preschool learning environment.



For the past 25 years, we have been blessed to have Kären Beasley at the helm serving as our Director. Prior to that she'd been a teacher in Preschool classroom for five years. Her 30 years of care, devotion, leadership, shepherding, wisdom, and gentle spirit have led our program and it has grown tremendously under her direction, at one-

point enrolling as many as 200 students. As a member of FLRB, she has worked hard to connect the church to the preschool and the preschool to the church. She has believed that the stronger the bond between both, the more that both are blessed.

Kären has come to that time in her career where she and her husband Scott are ready to retire. While we all wish she'd stay on in her role as Director indefinitely, we also honor the 30 years she's dedicated to the Preschool and want to celebrate with her this transition. Fortunately, she will continue to be an active member in the church and will help to facilitate a successful transition.

Last October a Hiring Task Force was put into place and Scott Lindberg has done a fantastic job of leading us in deliberate process for finding a new Director. Scott was a part of a similar process in his last church in Kansas City. The task force has spent many, many hours deliberating—putting together a job description, listening to teachers, parents, congregational members and others as to what they thought were important qualifications in a new director, and working to widely post the position.

After prayerfully reviewing and interviewing applicants, the Preschool Hiring Task Force, supported by a unanimous vote of the Church Council, is overjoyed to announce that they have offered the position of Director of Preschool and Kindergarten to Laura Schleede.



Laura holds a Masters of Social Work (MSW) with a concentration in School Social Work. She has worked in preschool, elementary, junior high, and alternative educational settings and has experience as an educator in child and youth development. She has written for and secured large grants and overseen staff that have worked in the

area of child mentoring. She is a published author in the area of mentoring and has won many awards and honors. Her work has been recognized by the White House and in 2010 she was honored by President Obama. Laura, along with her husband Matt (the course materials manager of the UW Bookstore) and children Lily and Elise, are members of FLRB. She will work with Kären Beasley the rest of this school year as the Co-Director of our Preschool and Kindergarten and will subsume the role fulltime this June upon Kären's retirement.

Change can be a challenge. We certainly all grieve Kären's imminent retirement. She has been a truly wonderful staff member and teammate. But change is also an opportunity, and we welcome the new ideas and energy that Laura will bring to the Preschool and, in her new role, to the church. Let us welcome Laura into her new role even as we give thanks to Kären for all that she has offered!



MISSION TRIP FUNDRAISERS

Thousands of Puerto Ricans have been living without electricity, safe water or reliable sources of food since hurricane Maria struck. The youth will have the opportunity to work alongside the local church and help families rebuild their homes and lives. During the year, the youth will be working on raising money for their trip this summer. There will be many ways to support the youth throughout the year. Here are a few upcoming opportunities:

144 Envelope Fundraiser

Envelopes numbered 1-144 are hanging in the narthex of the church. Each envelope represents a dollar amount. If every Envelope is taken and returned with the corresponding amount of money we will raise \$10,000. This will cover about half of the trip. When you return your envelope put your name and address on it and the youth will write you a postcard after the trip sharing about their experience

Easter breakfast is our big youth fundraiser each year. All youth wanting to go on any of our mission trips or retreats can work this fundraiser to earn money for their trips. Breakfast is a free will donation and 100% of what you donate goes towards the kids you see working. You are not paying for eggs, you are giving youth an opportunity to grow in their faith and serve others.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Hello from the music program at FLRB! I'm sure everyone is looking forward to Spring as the snow melts from Seattle's most recent blizzard. I'm truly thankful for the changing seasons here in the Pacific Northwest- it's not Winter for too long before our landscape comes to life again. Just like Winter moving into Spring, our music at FLRB will move from Jesus' teachings, through Lent and Holy Week, and finally to Easter. Musically, we have much to look forward this season:

Friday, March 1st: Compline Choir: England Pilgrimage Concert at 7:30 pm. Wednesday Night Lenten Dinner and Services: Beginning at 5:45 pm with a potluck-style dinner served in the Fellowship Hall, then processing to our Sanctuary for a short service at 6:30 pm, come and hear members of our music ensembles sing and help lead these beautiful times of meditation.

Holy Week: Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, April 18th & 19th @ 7:00 pm: These contemplative services at First Lutheran focus on Christ's journey to the cross and help us to pause and meditate on how he suffered. Our music will reflect this journey, leading up to a performance of *Jesus' Seven Last Words* by Dale Wood for our Good Friday service.

Sunday, April 21st: Easter Sunday! We will be celebrating at three services: 8:00 am with our praise band, and 9:30 am & 11:00 am with Brass Quintet, Bell Choir, Choir and Organ. A truly festive morning!



LENT BOOK STUDY

A Note from Pastor John

If you were to ask the disciples, "What's Jesus secret? What enables him to live such an extraordinary life?" I think if they had to answer in one word, that word would be prayer. No one has ever prayed like Jesus. It marked his life. We're told in the Bible from the beginning to the end about how prayer marked his life.

We're told that after he was baptized, as he was praying the heavens opened up, and the Holy Spirit came on Jesus. Think about that for a moment. He experiences God in prayer. And then immediately he went into the wilderness for 40 days of fasting and solitude and prayer alone with God as he faced temptations.

In Jesus life, when did he pray?

- He prayed when his schedule got demanding. When he began his public ministry the news spread all the more so crowds of people came to hear him and be healed. But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed.
- He prayed before big decisions in his life. One night, we're told, Jesus went out into the hills and spent the night praying to God. When morning came, he called his 12 disciples. Before he chose the 12, he spent a night in prayer. Can you imagine what it would be to have the major decisions of your life just bathed in prayer like that?
- He prayed when he was disappointed. When John the Baptist was beheaded, we're told he withdrew to a solitary place to be alone with his Father and to pray.
- He prayed when he was worried about his friends. Jesus says to Peter, "Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift you as wheat, but I prayed for you." Can you imagine what that must have felt like for Peter to have Jesus say, "I prayed for you that your faith may not fail." Think about Jesus praying for his friends.
- He prayed when he faced his ultimate challenge. On the night of his betrayal, Jesus went to the Mount of Olives to pray.

From the beginning of his ministry right through to the end, his closest friends, his disciples, had a front row seat to watch the greater pray-er who ever prayed. And they saw him filled with peace and wisdom and spiritual power and grace when he prayed.

In fact, they were so awed by Jesus' prayer life that they asked him one day, "Lord, teach us to pray." Jesus did and what we know as the Lord's Prayer is his teaching.

This Lent, we as a congregation are going to learn from the master of prayer. Our Midweek Lenten Series will be focused on the Lord's Prayer. We have also found a wonderful book entitled "The Revolutionary Power of the Lord's Prayer" and we are encouraging the congregation to purchase the book as we read it together. After each Wednesday night service, I will lead a conversation on a chapter of the book in the Library. All are invited.

Let's together take this Lenten season to learn to tap into the power Jesus tapped into as we learn how to pray well.


